WASHINGTON, March 20.---Active operations are being made to carry into effect the law providing for the issuance of postal notes for fractional amounts, less than \$5. and also for reducing fees on monev, and increasing to \$100 the limit of a single money order. It is thought by the superintendent of the money order division, that the new postal notes will be ready for the public before the first of September.
